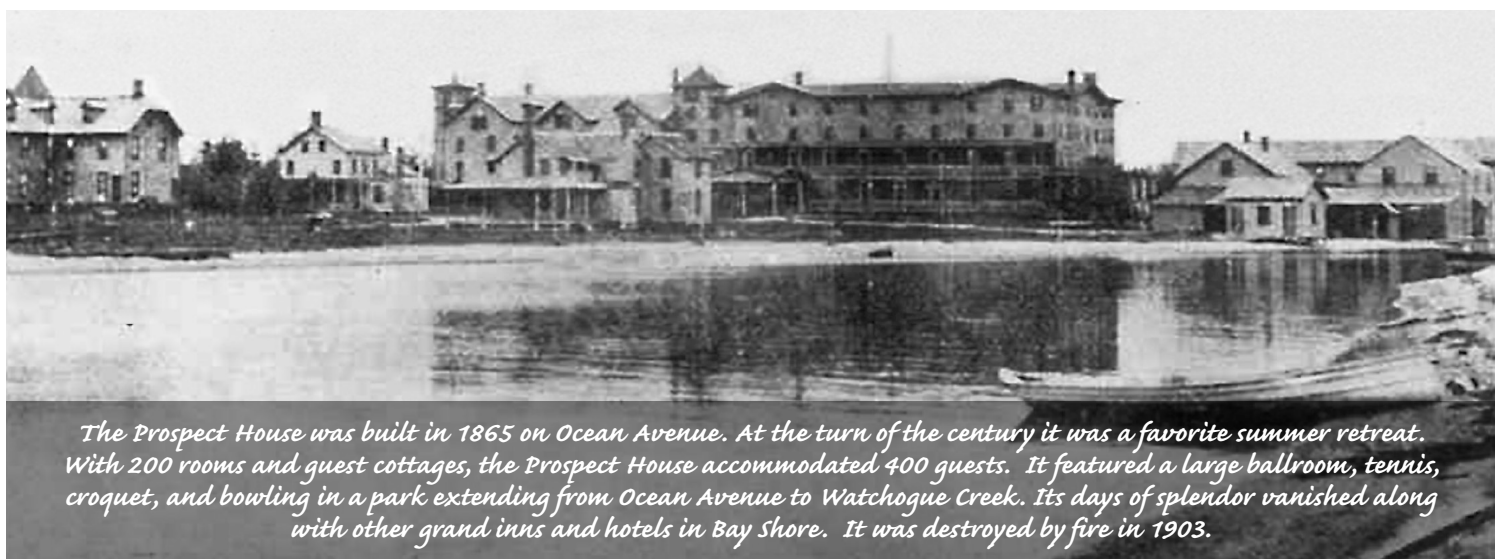

The Prospect House was built in 1865 on Ocean Avenue. At the turn of the century it was a favorite summer retreat. With 200 rooms and guest cottages, the Prospect House accommodated 400 guests. It featured a large ballroom, tennis, croquet, and bowling in a park extending from Ocean Avenue to Watchogue Creek. Its days of splendor vanished along with other grand inns and hotels in Bay Shore. It was destroyed by fire in 1903.
